 - Team members could include district special education staff, consulting teacher cohorts, special education & general education teacher teams including paraprofessionals
 - Training can be expanded to include regional districts
- Assists in the development and implementation of district specific goals developed through coaching and training activities

The requesting district agrees to:

1. Assign a staff member who will serve as Primary Facilitator
2. Assist in the development of training goals
3. Agree and arrange for a training location
4. Participate in and complete evaluation related to the assistance provided

SESTA BEHAVIORAL COORDINATOR RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Review request for District-Based Behavior Training with the District Administrator
 - a. Via conference call
2. Identify the target audience
3. Coordinate training activities and schedule with Primary Facilitator
4. Deliver the training
5. Provide training evaluation data to the Primary Facilitator
